January's temperatures certainly provided us with many opportunities to stay indoors and focus on our quilting projects. Although it was one of the coldest nights in January, it was a pleasant surprise to see the excellent attendance at our meeting. In addition, we started the year out on a positive note, with two guild members volunteering to work with a few executive members rewriting/editing our by-laws.

Next our challenge will be to determine how we want to manage the Comfort Quilt initiative. Currently, quilts are the primary contribution we make to the community but we are considering reducing the number of quilts and introducing three or four new projects to meet other needs. In order to determine which projects to proceed with, we are planning on having guild members vote at the February meeting. The projects we are voting on are fidget quilts, wheel chair quilts, baby quilts, placemats, pillow cases, Christmas stockings and medical bags. Some of the above are currently being made by our guild on an ad hoc basis. If you have any other ideas, please come prepared to add them to our list.

Each new project would have a team leader, who would decide how to accomplish the project, i.e. by organizing workshops or preparing and distributing kits for sewing at home. Based on the results of the vote, a detailed description of the selected projects, with the team **leader's duties and responsibilities will be written.**

Our February meeting is going to provide us with a hands on opportunity to try a quilting method that many of us would not try on our own. What a great opportunity for many of us when there is an experienced quilter on hand to help!

Programme February 2025


Hello Members,

Workshop Dates




